

FAIRVIEW SCHOOL RESPECT WEEK October 2 - 6, 2017

The *Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act (P.L.2010, c.122)* requires that the week beginning with the first Monday in October (**October 2-6, 2017**) of each year be designated as a “Week of Respect” in New Jersey. School districts and charter schools, in order to recognize the importance of character education, are required to observe the week by providing age-appropriate instruction focusing on preventing harassment, intimidation or bullying. At Fairview Elementary School, a banner will be hung outside the school, celebrating “Respect Week”. Here is a list of activities for the week.

KICK OFF ASSEMBLY- Sept. 27th - 3 Screens “Action Hero (Against Bullying)”

Monday = School-wide pledge recited at 9am via PA system and students are asked to sign the pledge.

Students will read about Respect via PA system. Anti-bullying lessons are taught all week by Ms. Fitzgerald.

Tuesday = Students will read messages and acts of Respect via PA system. **Parent Workshop on Anti-Bullying** presented by the Essex County Prosecutor’s Office at **6:30 pm. (Adults only)**

Wednesday = Students will read a story on tolerance, *The Land of Many Colors*, via PA system.

Thursday = Students will read a Bee Respectful skit via PA system.

Friday = Students and staff **wear a yellow shirt, to display unity as we agree to be respectful to all!** Students with Ms. Fitzgerald will conclude Respect Week via PA system.

Parents please encourage your child/children to show respect for self, school, friends, home, and community at all times.
